



The Treble Clef




On the piano, the treble clef is played with the right hand. Notes can either sit on or above a staff line.

Here's a simple way to remember which notes sit on or in between the staff lines:






The Bass Clef




On the piano, the bass clef is played with the left hand. Notes can either sit on or above a staff line.



Reading Music: Music Vocab

Treble Clef Key Signature: a series of sharp or flat symbols placed at the beginning of the staff. If a note is marked sharp or flat in the key signature, it will always be played as so throughout the song. Standard Double End Begin Repeat Repeat Measure [Bar]: segment of beats defined by the time signature. Above are some different types of bar-lines. Time Signature: used to tell how many beats are in each measure and which note value gets one beat.

Basic Note Value and Rests



Rest: an interval of silence represented by a symbol which tells how long the rest lasts. Below are examples of different lengths of rests.
